Chapter One

God's Not Your Problem

Who's to blame?

It is amazing how many people blame God for their problems and all the troubles in the world. You will hear reporters, commentators, and even Christians attribute disaster and calamity as an “Act of God” or as God’s judgment on them or on a city or nation. Even insurance contracts use the terminology “act of God” to describe disasters in defining its coverage. Is God to blame?

I have listened to well meaning people while consoling parents who have lost a child accuse God of taking their child. I have witnessed many accuse God of disease or sickness and deemed it as God’s punishment or His way of disciplining a person. Does God punish people with disasters?

There are those who even quote certain verses from the Bible to affirm their assertion of God’s wrath being executed on a person or people. But, Is God really behind all the problems in the world? Is He causing disaster, calamity and storms? Does God use sickness and disease to discipline people? Many believe and assert that He does.

This kind of reasoning has caused many to reject God and many others to doubt and question their faith in God. If God is the cause of all these problems how can you ever expect God to help you? This train of thought is a form of deception that has filtered through the minds of many and ends up robbing them of their faith.

This is really a question about the character of God. What kind of God do we serve? How could anyone trust God if they thought He may strike them dead or inflict disease or disaster upon their lives. How could you have faith to believe God for help, hope, strength, direction, healing or anything else if you thought He was just looking for an excuse to strike out at you. In our society today, if a parent even spansks their child they run the risk of being accused of child abuse yet we readily accuse God of much worse.

Hebrews 6:1 instructs us as mature believers to be able to discern good from evil. Isaiah 5:20 warns, "*Woe to those who call evil good and good evil, who put darkness for light and light for darkness,*

who put bitter for sweet and sweet for bitter.” We find today many examples of people struggling to discern good from evil and many who are confused about the source of the problems they face thinking God is behind all the bad things that happen. There is a disconnect in our society today and as a result many are cynical without any real direction or absolute truth in their life. At the heart of where most people are in their attitude toward God stems from this question about God causing bad things to happen.

Until you know God's not the problem and that He is for you you can't have faith. There will always be a question in your mind that produces doubt. In order to know God is not the source of your problems you need to better understand the true character of God.

Chapter Two

God Is Good

“No one is good but One, that is, God”

When I was growing up we used to say this prayer at dinner: "*God is great, God is good, And we thank you for this food: By your hand we are fed, Give us, Lord, our daily bread.*" What a simple and short prayer yet good theology and better yet when you're done, the potatoes are still hot! My question is, "do you believe that prayer"? Specifically, do you believe that God is good?

It's easy and natural to answer, "yes" and it's easy to say "God is good" when things are going well. But when we are facing difficulties and when we're going through a time of pain, hardship, or trial, then it becomes more of an open question. Our response at those times does not come as quickly or automatically. Often we have this small voice in the back of our mind questioning and wondering "Is God really good?" Why is this happening to me?

We have to overcome the teaching of traditional religion in many circles that say God might make you sick one day and the next day He might make you poor. They teach natural disasters that hit a city or area is God's judgment because of the

ungodliness in that place. As a result many doubt God and do not believe they can depend on the goodness of God.

That is contrary to the written Word of God. God is not confused about good and evil or the difference between a blessing and a curse. When we blame God and accuse Him of causing tragedy, disaster, and calamity it is an attack on His character.

I want you to know unequivocally with out question - God is good! All the time God is good! The Bible teaches that God is good. He is morally upright and pure. He is just and righteous. There is not the slightest hint of evil, or sin, or wrongdoing in His nature. He is absolutely perfect and holy. GOD IS GOOD!

We find scripture after scripture declaring the goodness of God. Psalm 34:8 says, "*Oh, taste and see that the LORD is good; Blessed is the man who trusts in Him!*" Psalm 119:68 says, "*You are good and you do good*" Ps 100:5 says, "*For the LORD is good; his mercy is everlasting; and his truth endureth*

to all generations.” Acts 10:38 says, “Jesus went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed of the devil.” Notice He did not go around doing evil or putting sickness on anyone. I could quote literally dozens of other verses to make the same point. God is good!

This is a huge revelation that must be grasped and understood. We are dealing with the character of God when we talk about the goodness of God. If we think God is behind our problems we have no basis for faith. It is very dangerous to falsely accuse God of the tragedies and calamities encountered in life. If God is behind the problems in our life and in the world why would we want to trust God. God is not the source of our problems. He is not the author of disaster, calamity, sickness, divorce, murder, or tragedy.

The more we know God's goodness, the more we trust Him. The more we trust Him, the easier it is for us to put our lives into His hands. Only by placing our lives in His hands can we open the way for Him to save us, bless us, help us and work through us, so that His will can be done in our lives.

Jesus is the good shepherd. Psalm 23 gives us a wonderful description, *“The Lord is my Shepherd [to feed, guide, and shield me], I shall not lack. He makes me lie down in [fresh, tender] green pastures; He leads me beside the still and restful waters. He refreshes and restores my life (my self); He leads me in the paths of righteousness [uprightness and right standing with Him—not for my earning it, but] for His name's sake. Yes, though I walk through the [deep, sunless] valley of the shadow of death, I will fear or dread no evil, for You are with me; Your rod [to protect] and Your staff [to guide], they comfort me. You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies. You anoint my head with oil; my cup runs over. Surely or only goodness, mercy, and unfailing love shall follow me all the days of my life, and through the length of my days the house of the Lord [and His presence] shall be my dwelling place (The Amplified Bible).”* We need the goodness of God. Psalm 27:13 puts it this way, *“What would have become of me had I not believed that I would see the Lord's goodness in the land of the living!”* I know it is only because of the goodness

of God I am where I am today. He has rescued me and delivered me more times than I am even aware. God has been good to me and it is not because of anything I have done. The favor of God is released upon our lives because of His goodness.

God wants to bless you too! He wants to bless you spiritually. He wants to bless you physically. He wants to bless you in your finances, in your relationships, and in your career. He wants to give you the desires of your heart. He wants to bless every area of your life. I know that sounds too good to be true, but that is what the Gospel is. The word Gospel actually means “Good News that is too good to be true” When you think about the fact that God sent His son to pay for all our sins and that He died so we could live by faith in Him, that sounds too good to be true. But it is absolutely true!

James 1:17 says, *“Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and comes down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow of turning.”* Notice what is coming from the Father - Good Gifts not pain, tragedy, and disaster.

Also, notice there is no changing with God. He is always good! God is the originator of goodness and His goodness is perfect and infinite.

God's desire is for us to experience His goodness so we have life abundant and more abundantly. (John10:10) We should wake up each day filled with joy and thanksgiving. Every time we take a breath or look at our children, or get in our car, or go to our job, or even in the middle of a difficult situation, God's desire is for us to experience His goodness! What would have become of me had I not believed that I would see the Lord's goodness in the land of the living. GOD IS GOOD!

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Chapter Three

Why Do Bad Things Happen

“Just Because God Allows Bad Things to Happen, does not mean it is His will”

If God is good then the question asked by many is, “Why do bad things happen and why would a good God allow bad things? It is an excellent question and a legitimate question. However, there is an incorrect assumption made by most Christians and non Christians alike that create and cause most of the confusion, and that is the belief that **“God is in Total Control”**. This is the position many people take or at least espouse. However, God is not in total control in the sense that most people think. God is sovereign and He is creator of the universe and He has a master plan that ultimately will be carried out, but He does not control the lives of people and events. He has delegated authority and power and allows people freedom of choice.

Let me explain. When God created the human race, He put them in control. He gave them “free will”, the ability to make their own choices. Mankind was given authority (control) in the earth. (Genesis 1:26) However, when Adam and Eve sinned by disobeying God mankind lost their control to Satan and corruption came into the earth that affected all of creation. To illustrate, it is like a landlord giving you a lease on a

piece of property and that lease then gives you complete control over that property. Then you sublease it to another who then has the control over the property. God leased the earth to mankind and Adam then subleased it to Satan. This was not God's plan. If God was in "total" control He would have immediately stopped that transaction.

Everything changed at that moment when Adam lost dominion to Satan. Death, disease, and sin all entered into the earth. The human race and the earth itself were cursed. Man had lost dominion and now Satan became the god of this world. (2Corinthians 4:4) Satan had control.

However, God had a plan. Remember, God is still God and He is all knowing, all powerful, and omnipresent. He knows the beginning from the end. He has control of the overall plan and I can guarantee you in the end He wins. He knew mankind was going to mess up so He had a plan in place. His plan was a plan of redemption for man and to get control back from Satan. God's plan was His son Jesus. The Bible, Genesis to Revelation, is really the story of

Gods plan of reconciling mankind back to Him through Jesus.

Jesus, the Son of God, came into this world first to “seek and save the lost” (Luke 19:10) and second to, “Destroy the works of the devil“ (1John 3:8). Jesus fulfilled His purpose. He acknowledged His work was complete when on the cross, He shouted out “It is finished“. (John 19:30) He had saved the world and destroyed the works of Satan. Colossians 2:15 tells us, “And having spoiled principalities and powers, he made a show of them openly, triumphing over them in it.” In other word Jesus took back control from Satan.

Jesus then delegated that authority (control) to the church. The church being the people who believe in Jesus. We as Christians now have the power and authority to rule in this world. We have control. God has given us power of attorney to take authority in this world. We are to be submitted to the authority and Lordship of Jesus as we exercise that authority. We don't have control over people but over the spiritual atmosphere and environment. Jesus put

it this way in Matthew 18:19, “Assuredly, I say to you, whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven.”

Satan is still loose in the atmosphere of this world and He goes about trying to deceive people in order to steal, kill and destroy. So, there are dynamics in place that allow evil and works of darkness to happen where the church does not exercise it's authority. The main point to understand is God is not in control of all that happens in the earth. So, that opens the door for several different sources to have influence in this world that can cause bad things to happen. In fact there are four main sources of the bad things that happen in the world today:

1) The works of darkness - this includes Satan and demonic forces

2) The fallen earth - this includes the environment, storms, nature, etc

3) Other people - individuals, groups, political activity, nations, etc

4) Our own actions - this includes mistakes, bad decisions, wrong choices, failures, etc

Works of Darkness

There is a spirit realm that is very real. It can not be seen but it is there. Some are skeptical of the idea of an invisible spirit realm while others get overly enamored by the realm of witches, psychic activity, and the Para normal. Even though you can not see the spirit realm with the natural eye that does not mean it does not exist. 2 Corinthians 4:18 says, “while we do not look at the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen. For the things which are seen *are* temporary, but the things which are not seen *are* eternal.” In other words the unseen is more significant and real than what is seen.

There are many things we can not see but we know they exist. For example, the wind - how do you know there is wind? Can you see wind? No. However we can see the effects of wind, the tree leaves moving, a flag blowing etc. Can you see the

high frequency waves that are used by cell phones, radios and televisions? No. But, we know they exist because of the picture we see on our television, the music we hear on the radio and all the things we do with our cell phones. The point being just because you can not see the invisible spirit realm does not mean it does not exist.

In fact this is the dimension Satan, demons and angels occupy. They attempt to influence this world through people they gain access to and are able to influence. The scriptures tells us in 1 Peter 5:8, "Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil walks about like a roaring lion, seeking whom he may devour." As I explained earlier Jesus disarmed Satan by regaining the dominion and power he had taken from Adam however, Satan still has the right to occupy the air space of this world. Even though he does not have the authority to control this world any longer he works to influence this world through deception.

2 Corinthians 2:11 encourages to not be ignorant of the schemes and devices of Satan so he

does not take advantage of us. We need to be alert and on guard of his devices and schemes. The power of deception has caused many to be snared and create all kinds of problems in their lives.

There are leaders of nations that have become influenced by demonic forces and as a result they use their position and power in destructive and brutal ways that have caused suffering for their nation and others. In fact the demonic influence upon leaders throughout history has caused great pain and devastation in nations and the world. Many of the bad things that happen in the world are a result of works of darkness.

The Fallen Earth

The second source of bad things that happen is an imperfect earth. The earth is not in the place of beauty and perfection like it was when first created. The earth is still under a curse because of the fall of man in the garden of Eden. While Jesus redeemed the human race the earth itself is still under the curse of the fall. Romans 8:22 tells us that creation groans

and labors with birth pains. One day this earth will be destroyed and it will be replaced with a new earth.

(Revelation 21:1) While we are able to see a degree of the glory and beauty of God's creation, it is marred. One day it will be restored to its total perfection.

In the mean time all kinds of storms, tornados, hurricanes, earthquakes, and natural disasters occur that cause all kinds of loss, pain and tragedy. These natural disasters and the destruction they cause are not caused by God. Many of the bad things that happen in the world today are because of a fallen earth.

Other People

Many of the bad things we experience in life are the result of other peoples mistakes and actions that influence and impact our lives. These can be as a result of our direct contact with people in and around us - family, friends, co-workers, etc. or indirect

influence that people have on our lives - government, leaders, companies, systems, etc.

For example, a wife and children could be subject to poverty, abuse and many other bad things if the father is addicted to drugs, does not work, and has fits of rage. The bad things they experience are caused by actions of another person who has access to their life through relationship. Some one could be seriously injured in a car accident caused by a drunken driver. People who live in countries that are governed by corrupt and tyrannical leaders are subject to terrible conditions and encounter all kinds of bad things because of the influence that leadership has on the lives of the people who live in that country. There are actions taken by people years ago that continue to impact people many generations later.

It is important. when it is with in our ability, to choose the surround ourselves with people of Godly character. 1Corinthians 15:33 says, “Do not be deceived: “Evil company corrupts good habits.” Our lives are impacted by those who have access to our lives. When those around us make bad decisions

bad things can happen to us. One of the sources of bad things that happen in the world are the mistakes of other people.

Our Own Actions

Bad things happen because of our own actions. This is the most obvious of all the sources of bad things happening in our life. However, many find it very difficult to take responsibility for their own actions. We live in a society that is always shifting the blame. We seem to have all kinds of excuses like we come from a dysfunctional family or the wrong side of the tracks, or life has not been fair, or it is the Government's fault, or company, or Church, and of course it is Gods fault. We blame God for the bad things that are happening. Galatians 6:7 tells us, "we reap what we sow".

There are consequences, good or bad, to the choices and decisions we make. Where you are today is a result of the decisions you've made in the past. Where you will be tomorrow will be determined

by the decisions you make today. It is important to take responsibility for our actions.

When we make bad decisions they create problems for us. If we sin there are consequences for those actions. The actions we take impact our lives. In addition to creating problems for us we need to realize many times our bad choices effect other people too. It is important for us to determine to make quality choices and decisions, when we do our actions produce good results and we can avoid many bad things in our lives.

It is important not to harbor guilt or unforgiveness in our hearts because of past mistakes, failures, or disappointments. If we don't properly deal with the past it can continue to cause more trouble and problems for us. I have written a book titled, "Just Let It Go". Chapter Four

What To Do When You're in Trouble

Five Keys to Overcoming Trouble

So, if God is good and He is not the source of our problems what do we do when faced with problems? Is there hope to overcome the problems we face? Will God help us? There is no question life is filled with obstacles and challenges and no one is exempt. Jesus warns us that we are going to encounter trials in this life. He said in John 16:33, *“In the world you will have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world.”* The Psalmist in 34:19 says *“Many are the afflictions of the righteous, But the LORD delivers him out of them all.”* These are not the type of scriptures we have hanging on our refrigerator door or go around confessing everyday, but, notice while both verses predict challenges and problems they both provide great hope and the promise of overcoming every problem and experiencing victory. Here are five keys to overcoming the troubles we encounter in life:

#1 KNOW THERE IS HOPE

The ***first thing*** to do when in the midst of a difficult situation is to always know there is **hope**. We have His promise of victory. We can be of good cheer

because we can overcome every tribulation. We can take comfort in knowing God will deliver us from every affliction. If you are facing what looks like an impossible situation be encouraged and know things can turn around. There is HOPE!

#2 PRAY

The ***second thing*** to do is to call on the Lord, in other words pray. **God will help** you. Psalm 46: 1 tells us, “God *is* our refuge and strength, A very present help in trouble.” God is never far off. He is always present and He provides a place of protection and strength in the middle of our greatest challenges. Hebrews 4:16 says, “Let us therefore come boldly to the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy and find grace to help in time of need.” No matter the situation, circumstances, or problem God hears our cry and provides the strength, grace, and wisdom needed to in our time of need.

When Jonah ended up in the belly of a great fish because of a bad decision he made and the actions of others (those who decided to throw him

over board), he was in a terrible predicament. Yet, when he cried out to the Lord, God heard him and answered him. (Jonah 2:2)

God is a major source of help. He will give wisdom, strength, favor, protection and direction to help us. He is ready always to extend His hand of help. Don't wait until there is a crisis to call on God. Make God your partner every minute of every day. If a crisis arises don't hesitate call out to God.

#3 TAKE ACTION

The ***third thing*** to do when bad things happen is to take action. While God is a major source of help He expects us to do our part. When David faced the giant Goliath, God was the strength behind David and the help he needed to defeat the giant but David had to reach down pick up five smooth stones then load one of them in his slingshot and sling that stone. David took action to overcome the giant.

When people encounter bad things in their lives, they often feel overwhelmed by the problems to

the point of not doing anything. They become shell shocked and unable to respond. If you allow the problems to fester, they often take on a character of their own and the problems then deepen or become worse. It is vital we take action, but action that is Spirited directed.

#4 MAKE NEEDED ADJUSTMENTS

If you find yourself in a difficult situation, don't continue doing what you are doing. Sometimes we think that if we keep on doing what we are doing things will change. They won't. Doing the same thing and expecting things to be different is the definition of insanity. Stop doing what you are doing and do something else, anything else. Just remember, if you are in a hole, the best thing to do is stop digging and create a plan for getting out of the hole.

Begin making the necessary corrections and adjustments. If you've been knocked down, get back up. I grew up in rural Nebraska - farm land, corn, hay, cattle, and hogs. When I was about ten my Dad bought me a horse. It was a beautiful blue roan with

white mane, but it was an ornery horse. My grandpa helped me to break and train him. He would run for the barn or fence to rub me off of him or he would buck and throw me off. My grandpa would ALWAYS say, “grandson you’ve got to get yourself up and get back on that horse and show him who’s boss. Now do it right this time.” If you’ve been rubbed off or bucked off, if you’ve made a mistake, sinned, or made a bad decision, repent and get back up and do it right this time.

If you find yourself in a difficult situation don’t blame God but look to God for help. He is for you and not against you. Stop and ask yourself is there something you have done or are doing to create the situation. When we take the time, and with the Lord’s help, we can figure out what part we are playing in creating what we don’t want in our lives. Once you figure out what you need to do differently, do it. Knowing what to change and then not changing it doesn’t help you. Ask your self, “Where am I continuing to dig myself into a deep hole? Perhaps you continue to overspend creating more and more credit card debt or perhaps you are not taking the steps that will enable you to seek a better job.

Whatever you are doing that is creating a deep hole, stop, decide what actions you are doing that contribute to the situation and change it.

#5 BE THANKFUL

Don't panic, don't lose hope, don't give up but begin to pray and get direction from the Lord. Seek the Lord and inquire of the Lord and He will give you wisdom and understanding to make better decisions and right choices. Be thankful and grateful even in the midst of the tough and difficult times. James 1:2 says, "*Count it all joy...*". Paul tells us "*In everything give thanks...*" 1Thessalonians 5:18 Notice he did not say give thanks for everything. We are not to be thankful for the bad things happening but in the midst of them as we are working to overcome, be thankful.

Keep moving forward. Things could always be worse. "There was a preacher who, no matter what bad thing you said had happened to you, he would always say 'It could have been worse!' One day a man in his church decided to put a stop to this and attempted to stump his Pastor. So, at the door after

the service he told his Pastor, 'I had a dream last night', to which the Pastor replied 'It could have been worse'. The man went on, 'I dreamed I died', to which the Pastor replied, "It could have been worse.' 'I dreamed I died and went to Hell', the man stated. The Pastor replied, 'It could have been worse.' He thought he had the Pastor this time. 'Pastor, what could be worse than dreaming you died and went to hell?' The Pastor replied, "It could have been true!"

It doesn't matter what has happened to you ... "It could be worse." Know this, God is always GOOD and our experiences are not what defines the goodness of God. We should keep an attitude of gratitude, remembering, God will deliver us from every affliction and the Lord always causes us to triumph.

There is light at the end of the tunnel. You are destined to win. Victory is yours. Just begin to respond correctly with the Lords help and you will begin to see things turn around. Be thankful!

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Conclusion

You have been placed on the earth for a divine purpose. If you are going to fulfill your purpose you are going to have to overcome challenges and problems that are sure to come. You may be in the middle of a very difficult and trying situation right now. I want to encourage you, with the Lord's help you are destined to overcome every problem you are facing or will ever face. God is for you. He is not the source of the trouble.

There is one more question often asked that I want to address and that is, if God is good and He is not the source of the bad things that happen, why does He even allow them to happen? First it is important to understand that just because God allows something to happen that does not mean it is His will. I can't tell you how many times people assume bad things happening in a person's life to be God's will and then try to explain that God allowed these tragic things to happen in order to save them from some more tragic event in the future, or that people are

going to be better off for going through some difficult problem.

Just because God allows bad things to happen does not mean it is His will. God allows people to go to hell but that is not His will. The Word of God is clear that it is God's will for all to be saved. However, God has by His choice limited Himself and given man the freedom of choice. God allows things to happen and unfold, and consequences of those events and decisions can lead to bad things happening.

However, because of the goodness of God He can take the worst of circumstances and help to turn them for good. *“And we know that all things work together for good to those who love God, to those who are the called according to His purpose.”* (Romans 8:28) God will work in the middle of the worst of situations if we will let Him. You may not be able to see how it is working for good or you may not feel like things are working for good or you may not understand how it is working for good, but you can be assured and put your trust in the Lord. He will work it for good.

Never forget you are not alone. God has not forgotten you. *“For He Himself has said, “I will never leave you, nor will I ever forsake you.” (Hebrews 13:5) “I lift up my eyes to the hills. From where does my help come? My help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth. He will not let your foot be moved, he who keeps you will not slumber. (Psalm 121:1–3) He is your strength! “He gives strength to the weary, and to him who lacks might He increases power. “(Isaiah 40:29)*
